AJC Bose Memorial Lecture 2022 on "Think Outside the Box. Be an Entrepreneur!"

On 9th June 2022 Department of Botany, ABN Seal College had arranged AJC Bose Memorial Lecture on "Think Outside the Box. Be an Entrepreneur!" The Speaker of this lecture was Prof. Krishnendu Acharya, Department of Botany, University of Calcutta. The lecture was arranged in online platform via Google meet from 11 AM to 1.30 PM. Total 90 participants had joined this online lecture given by Prof. Acharya. The main focus of arranging this kind of memorial lecture is to distribute awareness among the students, their understanding about how can we use our knowledge in practical aspect i.e. to use their knowledge to utilize their everyday waste product (which we say so but actually not) into creating purposes. The students' interaction with the eminent speakers, their queries in multiple directions, their eagerness to know outside of their knowledge etc. In this memorial lecture Prof. Acharya was speaking about how do we create our own instruments with our everyday use products with a minimum costs than the costs we bought them from the market. Moreover he also told about components of organic farming along with his own innovative. The useful aspects of farming and to make the farmers aware about their components which they bought from the market at very high costs. He also mentioned about cheaper and effective biofertilizers and green manuaring which farmers can use for their crops and which was also safe and very effective for their productions. The students were much enriched with his enormous knowledge and also they gained a lot from this lecture. Some students were very touched with this knowledge that they told Prof. Acharya that they are willing to take this part of lecture as their future project. 


Figure: Snapshot with respect to AJC BOSE Memorial Lecture 2021-2022


DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY




Session 2021-20222, Department of Physics





BRIEF REPORT OF THE ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES ORGANISED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY IN JULY 2021- JUNE 2022

1.E-LECTURE (ONLINE MEMORIAL LECTURE)

Department of Philosophy organised an online memorial lecture on 8th June,2022 from 11.30am. The deliberation was on "The Concept of dharma in Indian Ethics; its Impact on Social and Moral Life.:" Dr. Gargi Goswami, Associate Professor, Department of Philosophy, Jadavpur University discussed on the same. She elaborately explained the concept of dharma, its historical development in Indian history of Religion and Ethics. Then she discussed the significance of dharma in social and moral development of Indian life with special reference to Budhhism.All the participants were highly enlightened by her deliberation. 65 students and 5 faculty members attended and six from the students asked very relevant questions on the concept and development of dharma. Total duration of the deliberation was 3 hours. No photos are available due to the online mode of presentation.

2. Students Seminar

- **A)** An online students seminar was held on 12/8/2021 on "Ethical Values in Budhhism" from 11am..Avijit Das and Sandip Biswas from 5th semester (Hons.) presented their views on different moral aspects of Budhhist philosophy. Avijit Das dealt with astangik marga or eight-fold path and how they lead to nirvana. Sandip Biswas discussed on four noble truths, development of Budhhism from Hinayana to Mahayana, and how Budhhist ethics deeply influenced the Indian society.80 students and 5 teachers participated in the seminar. In the question-answer session 4 students asked some relevant questions. Total duration of the seminar was 2 hours.
- **B**) Department of Philosophy arranged an online student seminar on 11/01/2022 from 12 noon. The topic of the seminar was "Women Empowerment and Some Issues". Ria Datta and Dipa Saha from 5th semester Hons. presented their concepts on women empowerment. Ria Datta discussed the development of feminist movement and how the feminist philosophers highlighted the significance of the empowerment of the women. The basic philosophical issues were reflected in her presentation. Dipa Saha mainly discussed on the present scenario of women empowerment, real challenges it faces all over the world with special reference to the Indian society. 75 students and 5 teachers attended the seminar. A very interesting question-answer session was there with lots of very relevant questions from the participants. Total discussion was of 2.30 hours.

4. MOTIVATIONAL SPEECH FOR THE STUDENTS

Department of Philosophy organised a motivational speech for the students on 17th November, 2021 from 11am. Prof. Baishali Majumder, Assistant Professor, Department of Philosophy, Coochbehar Panchanan Barma University shared her views with the students. Dr. Majumder emphasised on the moral elements in education system with special reference to Swami Vivekananda and Rabindranath Tagore. She explained the philosophy of education as

conceived by Swamiji and Rabindranath. In the context of present education system she encouraged our students with some pragmatic advice. Students were really motivated by her suggestions regarding their future course of studies and various professional courses. Total no. Of participants was 50 and the duration was 2 hours. A question-answer session followed her presentation with relevant queries from the students.
