Publishing Guidelines

Prepare Your Manuscript

Regular Articles (no length limit)

Regular Articles are **Original research pieces** as well as **Review articles** on various celebrated arena of natural science that fulfill the editorial standards and scope.

Writing the Paper

Audience

Your manuscript should be tailored for a technical audience involved in diverse scientific areas and foundational concepts, avoiding unfamiliar terms.

Relevant context

The main findings of the paper should be appropriately framed in relation to existing literature.

Article Templates

A PDF version of your paper is sufficient for peer review. However, submitting well-formatted source files in LaTeX or Microsoft Word facilitates the process, as information can be extracted more easily. These source files enable quick preparation for publication upon acceptance. They will be converted to a PDF during the submission process.

Content

A paper should be able to stand alone and be clear without Supplemental Material. Editors may ask you to merge Supplemental Material into the main text or Appendices if required.

Peer Review

All articles follow the peer review procedure.

Responding to Referee Reports

When resubmitting your paper, make sure to check the following to facilitate quick preparation for publication if it's accepted.

- Equations are correct and well explained.
- Author names and Acknowledgment statements.
- The byline footnote lists the email address of the contact author(s) for post-publication correspondence.

Time Frame for Resubmission

Submitting your article again as quickly as possible ensures that your results are shared in a timely manner.

After Acceptance

Proofs and Corrections

Authors should anticipate receiving proofs of their manuscript, including marked changes, approximately two weeks after acceptance.

Proofs are delivered to the Corresponding Author, and the production process usually consists of two rounds of proofs.
