BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College boasts a rich history spanning more than 135 years. Originally founded as Victoria College in 1888 by Maharaja Nripendra Narayan, the ruler of the Princely State of Koch Bihar, it was one of the 1st category colleges by the statute of Calcutta University located at the Mofussil area. Maharaja Nripendra Narayan, the then ruler of the Princely State of Koch Bihar was passionate about promoting education in the region. He was deeply involved in developing the academic environment of the state, leading to the establishment of Victoria College as a centre of higher education. Initially named after Queen Victoria to mark the 50th anniversary of her coronation, the college's foundation was significantly influenced by the Maharaja Nripendra Narayan. Following India's independence, the Princely State of Koch Bihar joined Bengal Presidency in 1948 and was fully merged with West Bengal on January 1, 1950. Consequently, the college was taken over by the Government of West Bengal. In 1962 as soon as University of North Bengal was established, Victoria College was disintegrated from the University of Calcutta and started its journey as a affiliating college under University of North Bengal. In 1970, in order to commemorate the contribution of its first Indian Principal, the college was renamed as Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College. And thereafter, since 2013, this college has been an affiliated college under Cooch Behar Panchanan Barma University.

The founder Principal of the College was Prof. J. D. Goodley, who served the institution from 1888-89. Following him, the college saw brief tenures of two other Principals from abroad, Prof. Wood and Prof. Delafosse. It was then that Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal became the first Indian to assume the position of Principal, serving for an impressive 18 years from 1896 to 1913. Acharya Seal was not only one of the greatest philosophers and thinkers of modern India but also a pioneer in higher education in Bengal. He exemplified the principle of simple living and high thinking. He earned a Ph.D. and a D.Sc. from Calcutta University in 1910 and 1915, respectively. In 1914, he was appointed as the George V Professor of Philosophy, a position later renamed after him in 1950. Acharya Seal also served as the Vice-Chancellor of Mysore University. Acharya Seal was very closely associated with Rabindranath Tagore and at the request of Rabindranath Tagore, he inaugurated Viswa-Bharati in Santiniketan. In 1926, Knighthood has been conferred upon him. Under his stewardship, the College became famous as a centre of learning not only in Bengal but also in the whole of North-East India.

Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal was succeeded by T. L. Vaswani as the Principal of the College. Professor Vaswani was one of the earliest supporters of Mahatma Gandhi's Non-Cooperation Movement and a close associate of Mahatma. Later on, he moved across the length and breadth of India, inculcating national consciousness. In 1933 he founded the Mira Movement in Education which stressed on the cultural value of India combined with the modern scientific spirit of inquiry.

Prof. Chandrika Prasad Banerjee of the discipline of History was the Principal of this college from 1957-1959. Incidentally, he was the son of great historian Prof. Rakhaldas Banerjee. Prof. Pradip Mukherjee, a famous Geologist, and who acted as Principal of this College from 1969-1970, moved on as Registrar, Calcutta University and subsequently became Pro-Vice-Chancellor of Jadavpur University. Another stalwart who graced the chair of the Principal of this College was Prof. Bhabatosh Dutta (1975-1977). He was renowned scholar in Bengali literature and later on became the Vice-Chancellor of Visva-Bharati.

Victoria College and subsequently Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College can also boast of a number of celebrated faculties at different points of time. During the period from 1888-1930, Prof. Joykrishna Sen of the Department of English, Prof. Govinda Chandra Das of the then Department of Science, Prof. Jogesh Chandra Sinha Roy of Philosophy, Prof. Sarat Gupta of Sanskrit, Prof. Rajat Prosad

Neogi of Mathematics, Prof Bir Chandra Sinha of Philosophy, Prof. Jotish Chandra Bhadra of Mathematics, Prof. Lalit Banerjee of English, Prof. Kapileswar Sastri of Sanskrit are few such distinguished faculties. During the period of 1930-1950, scholars like Prof. Phani Bhusan Chatterjee of Chemistry, Prof. Sarat Chandra Gupta and his brother Prof. Amulya Chandra Gupta (both of them) taught English and the latter was an alumnus of this College too. Amulya Chandra Gupta's book on Rhetoric and Prosody is considered a valuable work in English language. Prof. Pratul Chandra Rakshit a famous scholar on thermodynamics was also faculty of this College during the forties. He had left a glowing account of his experiences in Cooch Behar. Prof. Debendra Kumar Ghosh served this College in the Department of Bengali. His book on History of Bengali Literature is listed in the Calcutta University. Prof. Chunilal Mukherjee of Economics and Prof. Durga Kinkar Bhattacharjee of English who incidentally were alumnus of this College, protested against the army deployment by the Maharaja in collaboration with the British Government at Cooch Behar in 1943. Prof. Durga Kinkar Bhattacharjee moved to Malda College as the Principal and later on he joined in the C. P. I. In the fifties of twentieth century, Prof. Sashi Bhusan Das and Prof. Santi Ranjan Banerjee of English (later moved to Burdwan University), Prof. Ganesh Chandra Bose (came from Dacca University and joined Jadavpur University), Bhabani Gopal Sanyal of Bengali (a famous writer), Kamal Kumar Ghatak of History, (moved to Calcutta University) were eminent faculties of this College. These distinguished faculty members have significantly contributed to the college's legacy, establishing it as a centre of academic excellence in Bengal and beyond.

Panchanan Barma, an influential intellectual and social reformer from colonial North Bengal, was an alumnus of this college. He completed his graduation in Sanskrit from this esteemed institution in 1893. He dedicated his entire life to the upliftment of backward classes and was a prominent Rajbanshi leader who engaged actively in political and social reform activities. He was a social reformer, scholar, essayist and folklore researcher. He became a Member of the Bengal Legislative Assembly in 1920. Pulin Bihari Das, a revolutionary in Pre-independent India, passed F. A. in 1899 from this College. Famous social activist, politician and writer of this area, Upendranath Barma was a student of this College from 1916-1920. Famous Folk (Bhawaiya) song exponent Abbasuddin Ahmed passed B.A. from Victoria College.

Notable novelist, short-story writer, essayist and playwright Amiya Bhushan Mujumdar passed intermediate of Arts from Victoria College in 1937. Later he graduated with Honours in English from this college. 'The God on Mount Sinai', a one-act play, serialized in two instalments in the magazine 'Mandira' in 1944 was his first published writing. Following that, his short stories "Promilar Biye" and "Nandarani" gained attention for their unique prose style when published in 1946 and 1947, respectively. Afterwards, his major novels "Garh Shrikhanda" and "Nayantara" started serialization almost simultaneously in 1953-54. He further published 27 novels, 115 short stories, about 50 essays and 6 one-act plays for the next fifty years. This prolific writer was awarded Bankim Puraskar (West Bengal government). Sahitya Academy prize, D. Litt from two Universities and other honours.

In the forties of the twentieth century, Sourin Bhattacharya became a leader of the Revolutionary Socialist Party was a student of this college. His brother Ramen Bhattacharya who later on became a Borough Chairman in London was also an alumnus. Sri Haraguri Gupta, who became a Professor in Canada, was a student of this college. Amit Roy and Ashok Roy, an engineer settled in Canada and a M. R. C. O. G (London) respectively were also students of this College.

Famous Bengali novelist Shirsendu Mukherjee studied I.A. in this College. Kalaguru Bisnuprasad Rava, an eminent freedom fighter from Assam and one of the pioneers of Assamese music and art was a student of this college. Prof. Prahlad Sarkar of Philosophy in Calcutta University, Prof. Sankar Kumar Bhowmik of Economics in Calcutta University, Prof. Hari Madhab Sarkar of Linguistics in Jawarhalal Neheru University were the students of this institution. Atreyi Ghosh of Chemistry (now a faculty in Alabama University, USA) is also the alumnus of this College.

The great history and tradition of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College, along with its continuing contribution to education in the region, have been recognized through significant accolades in recent years. In 2010, the University Grants Commission (UGC) honoured the college by designating it as a Centre with Potential for Excellence. In 2017, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) accredited the college with a Grade A rating. In 2024, in the 3rd Cycle of accreditation, NAAC once again accredited the college with Grade A+ with a score of 3.4, further enhancing its reputation and adding a feather to the institution's crown. These recognitions affirm the college's commitment to academic excellence and its pivotal role in the educational landscape of the North Bengal and North-eastern region of the country.



NAAC PEER TEAM VISIT

National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Peer team visited Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College, Cooch Behar on the 29th and 30th of April, 2024. The three member Peer team comprising of the Chairperson, Dr. Rajesh Kumar Singh Dhakarey, Member Co-ordinator, Dr. Nanda J. Puri and Member, Dr. Abdul Kader Parambat visited the college to validate the Self-Study Report (SSR) of the college for the 3rd Cycle of NAAC accreditation.

On April 29th, the Peer team, welcomed by the NCC, was honoured with a Guard of Honour from the College gate to the administrative block. The procession was marked by the presence of students and faculty members lining the route. The assessment process began around 9:30 a.m. with a presentation by the Principal in his chamber, followed by an in-depth discussion between the Principal and the Peer team members.

The Peer Team conducted a comprehensive assessment of the college, covering a broad range of aspects essential to its functioning and development. Their evaluation process included curricular aspects, teaching-learning and evaluation processes, research, extension and innovation activities, infrastructure and learning facilities and other aspects of the college. They held interactions with IQAC, all departmental heads, teaching staff, non-teaching staff, students, representative of Higher Education Department, alumni and parents. They also spent considerable time while visiting all academic facilities, administrative and support services. In this context, it may be mentioned that they were keenly interested to know the entrepreneurial skill development of our students under the guidance of Incubation centre for Innovative Ecosystem (ICIE). Further, they were eager to discern the uniqueness of the college Museum, Central Library and its archive, activities of NCC, NSS and functioning of two hostels, namely Nripendra Narayan Boys' Hostel and Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College Girls' Hostel. Cultural events, and three clubs, viz., Cine Club, Standard Club and Science club were also presented for their review and perusal. They checked documentary evidence, prepared their report and held an exit meeting with the Principal, IQAC Co-ordinator, NAAC Coordinator and all the faculty members of the college. They handed over its report to the Principal in its exit meeting on 30th April, 2024.

In the end, Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College was accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) on 9th May, 2024 with A+ Grade and a CGPA score of 3.4 in the 3rd Cycle of accreditation for the next five years.



ACTIVITIES

1. ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

1.1. Activity of the Planning Board

The Planning Board of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College is the highest level of important administrative body that attempts to design the institutional Strategic/ Perspective plan in each academic year in order to execute various activities of the College smoothly. Their responsibilities include approval of academic calendar, implementation of strategies to support students through various initiatives such as, Add-on course introduction, introduction of certificate and skill development courses, collaboration with various academic year, likewise, IQAC Planning Board of the college took utmost care for all round development of the college. Some of the mentionable initiatives are compilation of LMS and CO & PO in the college website, speedy approval of Students Free ship, framing guidelines for celebration of Annual Day of the college ('KRISHTI') etc.

1.2. Activity of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The IQAC of any institute is a "participative" and "facilitative" unit that works in association with the college authority and faculty members so as to plan out the best possible strategies for the institutional development so as to secure the internal quality assurance of it.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College has been functioning all-round the year in order to achieve the goal of action plans for quality evaluation, quality sustenance and quality up-gradation of the institute. Accordingly, the cell has been making concerted efforts to motivate and guide the students, teachers and non-teaching staff of the college for holistic quality excellence. Some of the most important quality enterprises taken up by the IQAC are the instigation and assessment of the students', teachers' and other stakeholders' feedback, being a regular affair of the IQAC, even amongst all adversities, extension of services in various forms benefiting the students of the college as well as the society at large, providing continuous impetus for the organization and celebration of major observable Days such as the International Yoga Day, World Environment Day, International Womens' Day to name a few.

In the academic session 2023-2024, IQAC took initiatives for the 3^{rd} cycle of NAAC accreditation of the college. And, thanks to its relentless effort for the last few years ultimately the college was accredited with Grade A+ with a CGPA score of 3.4, the second highest score among the Government Colleges in West Bengal so far.

To note further, observation of Annual Day of the College and publication of Annual Report, 'SAMAY' on that very day, which happens to be a narrative containing all undertakings and accomplishments of the college, students, teachers and staff well reflects the insight and judiciousness of the IQAC.



1.3. Activity of Anti-Ragging Committee

The Anti-Ragging Committee's main motto throughout all educational institutions is "Ragging Free Campus. To ensure the prohibition, prevention, and elimination of the scourge of ragging, the Anti-Ragging Committee of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College for the academic year 2023–2024 organized an orientation program on 24.08.2023 and 25.08.2023 respectively. This program included any behavior on the part of any student, whether through words or written acts, or handling freshmen or other students rudely, or engaging in rowdy or indiscipline activities that cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship, psychological harm, or to raise fear and shearing, among other things. The awareness campaign is effective, as there have been no reports of incidents involving rage from either the college campus or the hostel campus as of the conclusion of the academic year.



1.4. Activity of the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

The Internal Complaints Committee of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College is an independent administrative Committee which is instrumental in promoting gender neutral environment in the college campus. The committee has organized awareness programmes for sensitisation purposes in the last year. The Annual Gender Sensitization Plan of the last year has also been circulated among the students and staff of the college.

On 21st of July, 2023, the Internal Complaints Committee of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College undertook a voluntary activity of visiting a small village area around Natuar-par in District Cooch Behar, where clothes and chocolates are distributed to the children of the surrounding area. The experience was indeed fascinating and heart touching one, so much so that the committee decided to undertake many such ventures in the near future. Again, the committee visited the same place in the month of October 12th to distribute the clothes before Durga Puja among the children of that village.



Further, a One Day awareness programme on girl child trafficking was organized by ICC, Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College in February, 2024 in the adopted village named Natuar-par. The lecture was delivered by the District Child Right Protection Officer. A large number of the villagers particularly the parents of the girl child attended the programme.



Internal Complaints Committee of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College observed the International Women's Day which is being witnessed all throughout the world on 8th of March, but due to a national holiday, this year the observation in the institution got postponed and was finally held on 11th of March, 2024. The day was marked by a special lecture on crucial issues of women safety and the mode of legal safeguards that a woman can seek for, in cases of exigencies. The esteemed resource person of this lecture happened to be an expert from this field, Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, Cooch Behar, Sri Smarajit Ray.



The committee organized an awareness camp cum workshop on 'Self Defence Mechanisms' for safety of women on 11th March.2024 at college premises. The students particularly the girl students from each department participated and enjoyed the workshop. They learned the delf defence mechanism physically by the Trainer.



In addition to all these, the I.C.C. kept open its forum for anyone associated with the college, to lodge a complaint on any issue of concern and remained engaged with scheduled activities Nevertheless, the issue of gender sensitivity is not confined within classroom only, the college is extremely sensitive towards practical problems faced by the students and keeping in mind the typicality of sensitive issues that girls and other genders may face, provision of counselling was kept open though incidences reported have been negligible.

1.5. Activities of National Service Scheme (NSS)

The College has a very active NSS wing, which performs laudable activities to help the students grow into better citizens of tomorrow. Cultural, social and humanitarian activities are regular affairs with the NSS of this college. The NSS unit holds social service camps in rural areas where students and teachers work in collaboration with the local youth. Usually the program includes road construction, road repairing, cleaning of college campus (under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan campaign), cleaning of water tanks, plantation of saplings, organizing health checkup camps etc. Some of such programs of the NSS unit of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College in the previous academic session may be noted as follows.

1.5.1. Distribution of Clothes and Educational Materials at Adopted Village

1.6. Activities of National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The NCC plays an essential part in creating an integrative approach toward life. Enrollment to NCC is available to all college students. Students are advised to contact the NCC officer of the college immediately after admission for enrolment. Cadets pass the NCC "B" and "C" certificate exams each year. A portion of them travel the nation as part of NCC activities. The cadets assist the college's numerous departments in upholding law and order. Our cadets take part in the Republic Day parades in Red Road, Kolkata, New Delhi, T. S. C. Camp, Delhi, and other camps almost year.

Additionally, they are given honors such as the Honorable Governors' Medal and the Honorable Defense Minister's Medal. Our cadets are actively participating in various awareness campaigns, blood donation camps, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (SBA), plantations, street theater, and other events this year. The College's NCC unit conducted the following programs during the previous academic year.

1.6.1. Tree Plantation Programme

With the Tree Plantation program, the NCC unit began their extended social service activity in the 2023–2024 session. This program lasted for two hours and thirty minutes. This plantation program involved 34 participants in total (11 teachers and 23 students). Thirty trees were planted on the college campus and at other locations throughout the Coochbehar Municipality.



1.6.2. World Skill Day

1.6.4. Independence Day Observation

Our 1/13 Bengal BN NCC unit observed the 77th Independence Day on August 15, 2023, in the college seminar hall of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College, Cooch Behar. On that day, the cadets eagerly took part in a variety of cultural events. There are 102 participants in total for this program (Teacher's - 6, Student's 96).


1.6.6. NCC Day Celebration:



3.5. Observation of Student's Week



6. CENTRAL LIBRARY A Brief History:

The Victoria College was established in 15th June 1888. From the very beginning of its birth the College was granted Rs.25000/- as a special grant for building and its infrastructure including Library, Furniture & Laboratory etc.by the maharaja of Cooch Behar State.

In the first phase (1889 - 90) The College Clerk performed the duty of the College Librarian. In 1926 the Central Hall of the present main building of the College was converted to CollegeLibrary as well as Students' Reading Room. Since the 1st January 1950 the Victoria College became a government college under the Government of West Bengal and in the same time one post was created for Librarian. The central library was shifted many times from one building to another as it has grown in size. Central Library of the College was finally shifted to a two-storied building in the north- west side of the College campus in July 1999.

In 2022, 2nd floor of this building became ready to serve the students with hybrid reading room & digital library, audio visual classroom. The central Library is now playing the pivotalrole to upgrade the learning techniques and skills of the NEP students day by day.

 3^{rd} Cycle NAAC peer team declares Central Library is one of the three major features of this esteemed Institution.

Resources and Services:

The Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College has a vibrant Library & Information Centre embracing the print and digital resources which is one of the oldest and largest learning resource centres of West Bengal catering to the ever growing and uncompromising information and intellectual requirements of the students, faculty and researchers. It is quite large with approximately 1 lakh books including a huge number of rare and old books which are being preserved as a special collection. A.B.N.S.C. library has become one of the best-in-class college libraries in this state, complimented with state-of-art technology supports to the users. In addition to the print materials the library offers thousands of electronic books, journals, magazines, thesis and dissertations, learning videos, language learning facilities, newspapers and many more.

This center offers students hands-on experience in innovation, guided by faculty, management, and industry experts. With over 100 students already registered, the center serves as a platform for sharing innovative ideas and laying the groundwork for future startups. Building on this momentum, the center organizes various programs annually, with highlights from the academic year 2023-24 outlined below:

1. Orientation-Cum-Awareness Programme on Entrepreneur Development/ Khadi and Village Industries Commission Scheme:

ICIE, Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College, Cooch Behar, in collaboration with **KVIC** (A Statutory Body Under the Ministry of MSME, GOI), organized an Orientation-Cum-Awareness Programme on Entrepreneur Development / Khadi and Village Industries Commission Scheme on August 23, 2023. The event aimed to encourage students to consider entrepreneurship as a viable career option. Attended by 75 students and 10 faculty members, the programme featured insightful speeches by experts like Mr. Arup Chowdhury and Mr. Sudarsan Rajwar, who discussed entrepreneurship's role in economic growth, overcoming challenges, and leveraging government schemes like PMEGP. The session concluded with a vote of thanks and distribution of informative materials and sweets.

2. Workshop of Content Development:

The ICIE at Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College organized a One-Day Workshop on "Content Development" on February 24, 2024, in Vidyasagar Sabhagriha. The workshop, aimed at providing participants with insights into content creation and a structured approach to the field, was inaugurated by the Principal, Dr. Nilay Ray, who emphasized the importance of self-reliance and alternative career paths like content creation. The event featured two keynote speakers: *Mr. Ujjal Barman*, a renowned YouTuber of the channel *Bong Media*, and *Ms. Durga Chatterjee*, known as RJ Durga from Cooch Behar Radio Station. Ms. Chatterjee reflected on her career as a Radio Jockey, her experiences as an alumna of the college, and methods to overcome stage anxiety. Dr. Debojyoti Dutta, Director of ICIE, concluded the workshop with insights on content development and gratitude to the speakers and participants. The workshop benefited 56 students and 10 faculty members, fostering enthusiasm for innovative career opportunities.

3. NASSCOM Training cum Human Resource Management Programme:

The NASSCOM Training cum Human Resource Management Programme, an online training initiative under the pilot studies by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, commenced on **February 27, 2024**. Brief History of the Department
